



AN IMPORTANT MESSAGE FROM HART'S CHAIRMAN

As you would all be well aware, this season is proving extremely challenging for countless farmers across South Australia.

Very low growing season rainfall coupled with above average temperatures has had a significant impact with many crops noticeably struggling.

We know some of you have already had to make some hard decisions about how to manage this.

The Hart site is not immune. Some trials have been particularly vulnerable to severe moisture stress. In some cases, planned treatments will not be applied, or crops will not be taken through to harvest. Some trials are faring much better.

The Hart Field Day is on next week (Tuesday, September 17), and is always well supported with hundreds of people coming from across the Mid-North, the broader cropping regions of SA, and even interstate.

We think this year might be a little different, as we know it's hard to get motivated to 'look at crops' in a season like this.

However, the Hart Field Day is more than that, and we wanted to share our top four reasons for joining us:

- 1. Most of the sessions on this year's Hart Field Day program will share research from more than one season and this information will be valuable as we look to 2025.
- 2. There are three sessions on the Hart Field Day program with a focus on managing a dry start so there will be valuable take home messages to help us manage challenging seasons into the future:
 - Session M Crop establishment after a dry start
 - Session I Pre-emergent herbicides; selection and application
 - Session A Emergence & rainfall; getting back to basics
- 3. Other sessions will explain nitrogen efficiency fertilisers (Session B), help you navigate the carbon and net zero space (Session C), see what's on the horizon with our AgTech demos (Session T), managing crop decisions and legacies (Session N) and find out how a huge number of varieties and products are performing to date.
